

RESOLUTION 2016-20

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE CONTRACT THE CITY OF WAPATO HAS WITH YAKIMA VALLEY CONFERENCE OF GOVERNMENTS (YVCOG) FOR GENERAL PLANNING ASSISTANCE THROUGHOUT 2016

WHEREAS, the Yakima Valley Conference of Governments (the "Conference") is a regional planning commission established under RCW section 36.70.060 and Articles of Association of the Yakima Valley Conference of Governments, and

WHEREAS, on January 4th, 2016 the City contracted with the Conference for certain technical planning assistance as documented in that certain Technical Assistance Contract No. 010116WP (the "Contract"); and,

WHEREAS, the City finds it necessary to amend the contract to increase the maximum amount to be paid under the Contract from \$5,000.00 to \$10,000.00, to allow for additional technical planning assistance; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Wapato finds it is in the best interests of the City of Wapato to enter into a contract amendment with the Conference consistent with the preceding recitals.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WAPATO, WASHINGTON, AS FOLLOWS:

The City Council authorizes the Mayor to sign an amendment to Technical Assistance Contract No. 010116WP to raise the maximum amount to be paid under the Contract to \$10,000.00. A copy of the Contract is attached hereto for reference as Exhibit "1."



THIS AMENDMENT, entered into this 6th day of June, 2016 by and between the Yakima Valley Conference of Governments, a regional association having its territorial limits within Yakima County, State of Washington (hereinafter called the "Conference"), acting herein by James A. Restucci, Conference Chair, hereunto duly authorized, and the City of Wapato, a municipal corporation located within Yakima County, State of Washington (hereinafter called the "City"), acting herein by Mayor Tony Guzman, hereunto duly authorized;

WITNESSETH THAT;

WHEREAS, on January 4th, 2016 the City contracted with the Conference for certain technical planning assistance as documented in that certain Technical Assistance Contract No. 010116WP (the "Contract"); and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend certain sections of the contract;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties do mutually agree, to modify the contract to provide the following:

Compensation and Method of Payment:



RECOMMENDATION AND MOTION:

Staff recommends approval of the YVCOG Technical Assistance (TA) contract Amendment #1 for 2016 for up to \$5000.00.

SUMMARY:

The TA contracts are generally used for YVCOG services that are difficult to develop for specific scope of work and go beyond the normal services afforded by YVCOG. Wapato may get an application or grant that may be time sensitive that requires a specific scope of work that requires some expertise beyond staff capability. Services would only be rendered up to the sum of the contract. The Amendment is need when the monies proved for the contact have been exhausted and wen need to finish out the year with our projects.
